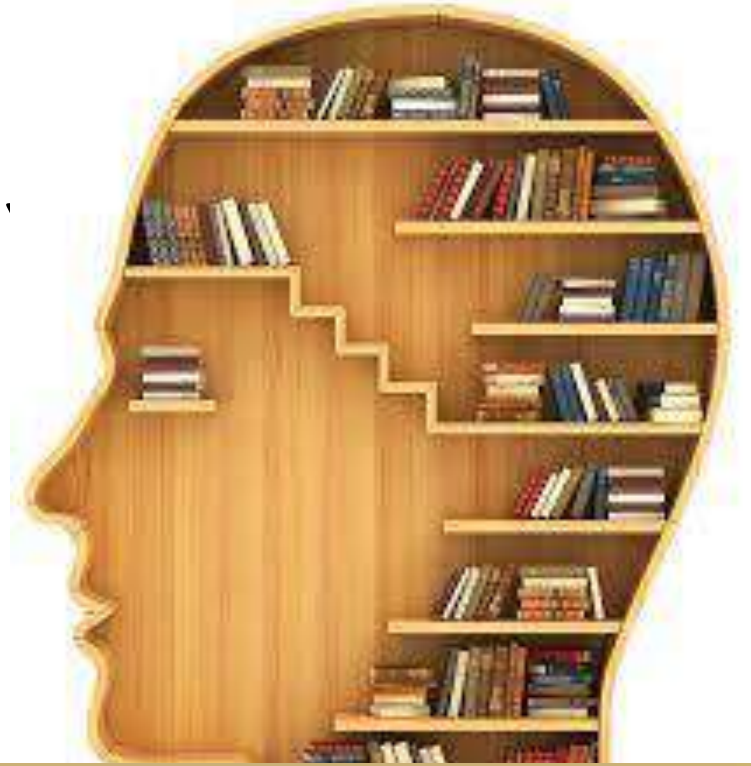

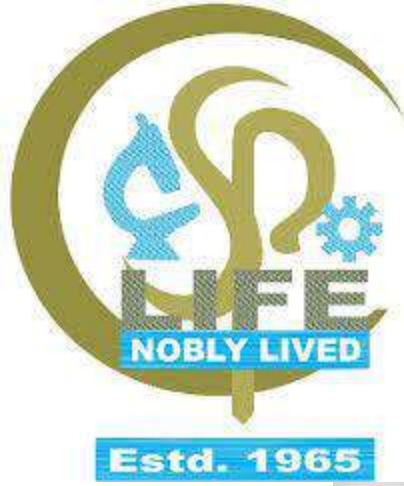
## Focus Area-5 Awareness of Career Opportunities

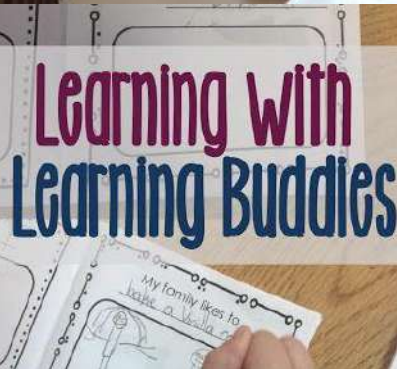




# INNOVATIVE LEARNING

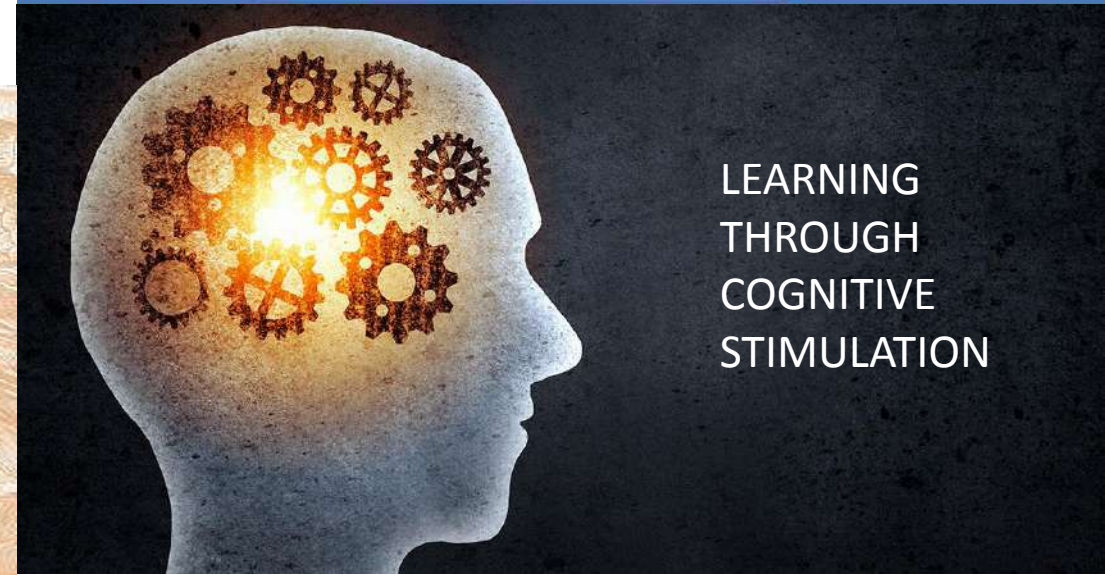
# Learning methods
